#### Task II Technical Assistance and Cost Share

##### A. Technical Assistance

Technical Assistance may include any of the following: landowner communication, feasibility investigation, conservation planning, project survey and design, construction inspection and certification, and/or cost share administration.

#### Task III – Education and Outreach

- Hosted SCWEP annual partnership meeting on February 19 where 2025 outreach priorities were established by the partnership.
- 5 SCENE articles submissions on the topics of nitrate testing clinic promotion, Buck Stream success story, cost share opportunities available, and spring workshop series promotion, and promotion of the new lending library opening.
- 17 social media posts related to chloride reduction, illicit discharge, natural landscaping, soil health, sustainable agriculture, and ecosystem BMPs reaching an audience of 885 followers.
- 1 youth education event
  - Assisted two high school students with their senior thesis projects in their sustainability classes, which included capstone projects on maintaining buffer compliance in agriculture fields.
- 4 community events
  - 1 soil health workshop hosted in partnership with NRCS and Le Sueur SWCD reaching 58 producers and featuring speakers on a variety of sustainable agriculture topics.
  - 1 "Scott SWCD Open House" hosted on February 12 with 20 attendees assisted with inquiries on tree care, wildlife management, and conservation cover.
  - 2 "Planting for Pollinators" workshops hosted on March 18 (22 attendees) and 20 (36 attendees) in Shakopee, and online respectfully.
- 192 mailers sent to producers inviting them to the February 26, 2025, soil health workshop.
- 2 KCHK radio ads detailing SWCD services, the upcoming tree sale, planting for pollinators, natural landscaping grants available, equipment rental, and ag incentives.

- 2 presentations at the UMN's 'Annie's Project' group meetings for female ag producers on March 17th (14 attendees) and March 26 (8 attendees).
- Redesign and restock of promotional signs including pollinator plantings, raingardens, native prairie, and soil health practices to be distributed to landowners who complete projects.
- Began communications to assist Shakopee middle schools with a storm drain stenciling project to take place in April.
